The Affordable Care Act (Obamacare) Coverage: Free Preventive Services

All Marketplace plans and many other plans must cover the following list of preventive services without charging you a copayment or coinsurance. This is true even if you haven't met your yearly deductible. This applies only when these services are delivered by a network provider.

15 Covered Preventive Services for Adults

- 1. Abdominal Aortic Aneurysm one-time screening for men of specified ages who have ever smoked
- 2. Alcohol Misuse screening and counseling
- 3. Aspirin use to prevent cardiovascular disease for men and women of certain ages
- 4. Blood Pressure screening for all adults
- 5. **Cholesterol screening** for adults of certain ages or at higher risk
- 6. Colorectal Cancer screening for adults over 50
- 7. **Depression screening** for adults
- 8. **Diabetes (Type 2) screening** for adults with high blood pressure
- 9. **Diet counseling** for adults at higher risk for chronic disease
- 10. HIV screening for everyone ages 15 to 65, and other ages at increased risk
- 11. Immunization vaccines for adults doses, recommended ages, and recommended populations vary:
 - Hepatitis A
 - Hepatitis B
 - Herpes Zoster
 - Human Papillomavirus
- Influenza (Flu Shot)
- Measles, Mumps, Rubella
- Meningococcal
- Pneumococcal
- 12. **Obesity screening and counseling** for all adults
- 13. Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) prevention counseling for adults at higher risk
- 14. **Syphilis screening** for all adults at higher risk
- 15. Tobacco Use screening for all adults and cessation interventions for tobacco users

22 Covered Preventive Services for Women, Including Pregnant Women

The eight new prevention-related health services marked with an asterisk (*) must be covered with no costsharing in plan years starting on or after August 1, 2012.

- 1. Anemia screening on a routine basis for pregnant women
- 2. <u>Bacteriuria</u> urinary tract or other infection screening for pregnant women
- 3. BRCA counseling about genetic testing for women at higher risk
- 4. <u>Breast Cancer Mammography</u> screenings every 1 to 2 years for women over 40
- 5. Breast Cancer Chemoprevention counseling for women at higher risk
- 6. <u>Breastfeeding</u> comprehensive support and counseling from trained providers, as well as access to breastfeeding supplies, for pregnant and nursing women*
- 7. <u>Cervical Cancer</u> screening for sexually active women
- 8. Chlamydia Infection screening for younger women and other women at higher risk
- 9. <u>Contraception:</u> Food and Drug Administration-approved contraceptive methods, sterilization procedures, and patient education and counseling, not including abortifacient drugs*
- 10. Domestic and interpersonal violence screening and counseling for all women*
- 11. Folic Acid supplements for women who may become pregnant
- 12. <u>Gestational diabetes</u> screening for women 24 to 28 weeks pregnant and those at high risk of developing gestational diabetes*
- 13. Gonorrhea screening for all women at higher risk

- 14. Hepatitis B screening for pregnant women at their first prenatal visit
- 15. Human Immunodeficiency Virus (HIV) screening and counseling for sexually active women*
- 16. <u>Human Papillomavirus (HPV) DNA Test:</u> high risk HPV DNA testing every three years for women with normal cytology results who are 30 or older*
- 17. Osteoporosis screening for women over age 60 depending on risk factors
- 18. Rh Incompatibility screening for all pregnant women and follow-up testing for women at higher risk
- 19. Tobacco Use screening and interventions for all women, and expanded counseling for pregnant tobacco users
- 20. Sexually Transmitted Infections (STI) counseling for sexually active women*
- 21. Syphilis screening for all pregnant women or other women at increased risk
- 22. Well-woman visits to obtain recommended preventive services*

26 Covered Preventive Services for Children

- 1. Alcohol and Drug Use assessments for adolescents
- 2. Autism screening for children at 18 and 24 months
- 3. **Behavioral assessments** for children of all ages
 - Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.
- 4. **Blood Pressure** screening for children
 - Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.
- 5. <u>Cervical Dysplasia</u> screening for sexually active females
- 6. Congenital Hypothyroidism screening for newborns
- 7. <u>Depression</u> screening for adolescents
- 8. <u>Developmental</u> screening for children under age 3, and surveillance throughout childhood
- 9. **Dyslipidemia** screening for children at higher risk of lipid disorders
 - Ages: 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.
- 10. Fluoride Chemoprevention supplements for children without fluoride in their water source
- 11. Gonorrhea preventive medication for the eyes of all newborns
- 12. Hearing screening for all newborns
- 13. Height, Weight and Body Mass Index measurements for children

Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.

- 14. Hematocrit or Hemoglobin screening for children
- 15. Hemoglobinopathies or sickle cell screening for newborns
- 16. HIV screening for adolescents at higher risk
- 17. <u>Immunization</u> vaccines for children from birth to age 18 —doses, recommended ages, and recommended populations vary:
 - o Diphtheria, Tetanus, Pertussis
- Human PapillomavirusInactivated Poliovirus
- MeningococcalPneumococcal

- Haemophilus influenzae type bHepatitis A
- Influenza (Flu Shot)
- Rotavirus

Hepatitis B

- o Measles, Mumps, Rubella
- o Varicella
- 18. <u>Iron</u> supplements for children ages 6 to 12 months at risk for anemia
- 19. Lead screening for children at risk of exposure
- 20. **Medical History** for all children throughout development
 - Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.
- 21. Obesity screening and counseling
- 22. **Oral Health** risk assessment for young children
 - Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years.
- 23. Phenylketonuria (PKU) screening for this genetic disorder in newborns
- 24. Sexually Transmitted Infection (STI) prevention counseling and screening for adolescents at higher risk
- 25. **Tuberculin testing** for children at higher risk of tuberculosis
 - Ages: 0 to 11 months, 1 to 4 years, 5 to 10 years, 11 to 14 years, 15 to 17 years.
- 26. <u>Vision</u> screening for all children
